### **Pupil Premium Strategy Statement**

#### 2018 - 2019

#### Rationale

Each year the school receives an amount of money called the Pupil Premium Grant (PPG). This grant provides additional funds to school for each child who is currently, or has been at any time in the last 6 years, entitled to Free School Meals (FSM). In addition, funding is also given for pupils who are 'Looked After' by the Local Authority or who are children of Her Majesty's Forces.

This academic year (2018-2019) our funding is £17,340

At Gainford CE Primary School, our aim is to ensure that any difference in attainment between groups of children diminish and all children achieve well. Whilst our main aim is to raise academic attainment, we also aim to ensure that children have a wide range of opportunities and experiences to develop confidence, self-esteem and have high aspirations.

NB: The school has taken note of the Education Endowment Foundation's 'Teaching and Learning Toolkit,' 'Maximising the Impact of Teaching Assistants' by the Institute of Education and 'The pupil Premium Making it work in your school' - Oxford School Improvement 2015 to inform its Pupil Premium Strategy.
