#### **Open the Book**

#### **Harvest Festival**

Our Harvest Festival takes place on the 19<sup>th</sup> October and some of our Year 5 and Year 6 pupils have been working very hard to take on more responsibility for the planning and delivery of this service developing their leadership skills. They have been working with Claire Mead, who leads Messy Church. All our children will be involved with the Harvest Service and all family and friends are welcome to attend. #### Winter Illness information

This week in assembly we have been talking to the children about the importance of handwashing and the use of tissues, in order to minimise the spread of the Norovirus (Winter Vomiting Bug) and Flu. Please support us at home, by following the advice detailed on the NHS Leaflet attached, this will minimise the spread within the school and also help to protect vulnerable members of our families and our community. Although Covid test kits are no longer routinely available if you do know that your child has Covid then they need to remain absent from school for 3 days after testing positive.
