# Message from the Headteacher

#### Remembrance

The children in school have learnt about the significance of the Armistice agreement signed on 11<sup>th</sup> November 1918 and about why some people choose to wear poppies. To coincide with this, work our Leaders of Worship Team helped each class to plan and design a Remembrance Prayer space and these were installed in St Mary's Church for the whole community to use.

Class Swale -Thoughtful Playdough. Children were encouraged to think of someone or something that they were grateful for. They then had to use the playdough to make a model of this and had time to talk about their feelings.

Class Wear 's prayer space focused on the 'The Empty Chair'. This focused on lost loved ones and symbolised the empty chair they leave at the table of our lives. Class Wear pupils wrote down some very thoughtful prayers.

Class Tees Remembrance Ribbons. This focused on world events and issues like the Ukraine War, and natural disasters such as forest fires and flooding. Children considered who had been hurt, who is helping and what or who may have caused this. They wrote prayers and thoughts onto labels and added coloured ribbons of remembrance.

Please try to call in to St Marys Church to see what the children have done. The prayer spaces are there for all to use.

#### Children in Need

Next week on Friday 18<sup>th</sup> November it is the annual Children in Need fundraising event and the theme this year is 'spotty'. 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Although it is a long way off our Year 6 pupils sit their Standard Attainment Tests in May of next year. It is very important that children are in school for preparation for these tests as well as for the test week itself. The tests are due to take place Week commencing Monday 8<sup>th</sup> May.

The government has now announced that Monday 8<sup>th</sup> May is to be a new bank holiday for 2023 so tests for the Monday will need to be rearranged and schools are awaiting advice on this. Please support your child by ensuring holidays are not taken in term time to give them every opportunity to be fully prepared.

# Community support for our curriculum

When children learn about Religious Education in school they not only learn about Christianity, but they also learn about other world religions. Class Tees are learning about Buddhism, and they had a visit from a member of our local community who is a practising Buddhist. He was able to share with the pupils about what being a Buddhist meant to him. RE offers lots of opportunity for reflection debate and discussion and children in our school are encouraged to accept that others may have different beliefs from their own.
