Visit from Fire and Rescue Service

Pupils in school, from pre -school to Year 6, had a visit from two fire fighters from Durham and Darlington Fire and Rescue Service They delivered a session with a focus on fire safety, be9ng safe on bonfire night and also gave them an insight as to what kind of incidents and emergencies they attended. The children certainly learnt a lot during the session and could remember the importantly safety messages.
