#### Luba and Ruslan

After hosting Ruslan and Luba from Ukraine during the autumn term the children and staff in school are always eager to hear how they are doing. They initially moved to Romania then onto Egypt. Luba, Ruslan and their older sister have been busy attending Ukraine school on- line and they finished for the summer at the end of May; their mum certainly wished that the school year ended a bit later in the year as their on- line schooling has helped to keep them focused. Our children remembered how difficult on- line learning was for them. Their parents had still hoped to move closer be able to access Odesa in Ukraine as they have elderly relatives still in Ukraine. However, the devasting impact on this region after the bombing of the Kakhovka Dam meant that this was not possible. Our pupils saw photos of the family and the children certainly looked very happy and healthy, although our pupils did recognise how difficult and different life must be for them to be away from family, friends, school and their home country. We keep them in our prayers and hope that there will be a resolution to this devastating, ongoing conflict.

#### The Hub Visit

The majority of our Year 5 and Year 6 pupils will be visiting The Hub in Barnard Castle on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> and Friday 7<sup>th</sup> July. They will be taking part in lots of outdoor and adventurous activities and also have team building and leadership opportunities too. I am sure it will be a wonderful experience of them and I know that they will have lots to say when they return to school each day. Unless your child has ordered a school packed lunch they will need to bring their own packed lunch on these two days. they will also need a change of clothes. I know that they will have a fabulous time!
