Message from the Headteacher

The school day

The school day starts at 8.55am and ends at 3.30pm. Unless your child is already at Breakfast Club please aim to have your child arrive at school so they can line up with their class and enter school at 8,55am. Our school gates open at 8.45am and children are welcome on the playground from then. We end the day at 3.30pm.

Waterbottles

Please send your child to school each day with a waterbottle containing water only. These can be refilled across the day. Water is also provided on the lunch tables for all pupils (school meals and packed lunches).

Lost property

Please label your child's clothing including PE kit, hats etc as this will help us return any lost property to the correct pupil. You do not need to buy name tags- even writing your child's name or initials on the clothing labels can help to reunite lost clothing with the correct owner. there is usually a large label on the inside of sweatshirts etc Uniform is expensive and our goal is to have a lost property box that is empty or at least one that doesn't resemble a mountain!!
